

Arthur was incarcerated for the first time before he graduated from high school. Then at the age of 20, Arthur robbed a bank and was sentenced to 15 years in prison. He realized one day that he didn't have anyone that was visiting him. He was alone. Arthur knew this wasn't how he wanted to live his life, and he was ready to change

in 2009, Arthur was transferred to Dillwynn Correctional Center where he was Introduced to Goodwill in September 2010. He began receiving services to prepare him for release and reintegration into society. Services included job search and interview skills, ethics, self-respect,

Arthur was released from prison on July 31, 2012. Within two hours of getting out of prison his Goodwill Case Manager helped him with a place to stay, clothing, identification, and a job interview. He entered a training position at the Goodwill store in Salem. Arthur was hired parttime as a Donated Goods Processor following his 90 day training period. Arthur began working as a cashier and shortly after was promoted to a full-time Sales Supervisor in the Salem Goodwill store.

Arthur has once again earned a promotion. He is now a Community Work Adjustment Training Case Manager working to help people to gain the necessary skills to get and maintain employment. He is married and is building a life that he and his family can be proud of.
